

ICSC Stewardship Parish Certification Standards and Evaluation

Deadline June 30 Each Year – Applicants must be an ICSC member in good standing

The International Catholic Stewardship Council offers a self-assessment tool/certification to help parishes that meet certain threshold criteria in regards to the practice and promotion of stewardship. A parish that satisfies these criteria and thoughtfully completes this evaluation will receive a certification, good for three years, and will be honored as an "ICSC Stewardship Parish" and have their name posted on the ICSC website.

This certification is a result of several objectives ICSC seeks to accomplish:

- 1. ICSC recognizes that many parishes are extraordinarily good stewardship parishes. The Archbishop Murphy Award can be given to only one parish annually, so ICSC would like another way to recognize the many other exceptional stewardship parishes, striving to be the best they can be.
- 2. ICSC is hopeful that the self-assessment requested for this certification will encourage parishes already practicing and promoting stewardship to some degree, to make a thorough inventory on how they can grow even more in this Christ-centered way of life.
- 3. ICSC desires that parishes achieving 'ICSC Stewardship Parish' designation will agree to mentor other parishes striving for this certification.

To receive this certification, a parish must be a member of the International Catholic Stewardship Council and agree to be listed as a "mentor" parish available to provide advice via e-mail or over the phone about promoting and practicing stewardship, for the three years following receipt of this certification. Under each goal are listed several objectives. For each objective, please briefly describe how your parish accomplishes the task. If your parish does something additional or unique, please describe that as well. Parishes must demonstrate they have made progress toward half or more of the objectives under each goal to receive certification.

After three years, each parish should re-evaluate their stewardship practices and re-submit for certification, or perhaps apply for the Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy Award. Former parish Archbishop Thomas J Murphy Award recipients are not eligible without special permission from ICSC.

The certifications will be announced and awarded at the ICSC Conference each year. *The application for certification must be submitted by* June 30. Parishes achieving certification will also be noted in the ICSC Conference Directory and on the ICSC website.
