Two Seas by Bruce Barton

There are two inland seas in the Holy Land. One is fresh, and fish are in it. Splashes of green adorn its banks. Trees spread their branches over it and stretch out their thirsty roots to sip of its healing waters. Birds nest in the trees. Along its shores children play. The River Jordan makes this sea with sparkling water from the hills.

Every kind of life is happier because it is there.

The Jordan River flows on South into another sea. Here there is no splash of fish, no fluttering leaf, no song of birds, no children's laughter. No towns are found on its shores, which are rocky and hard. The air hangs heavy about its waters, and neither humankind nor beast nor foul will drink from it. It is a desolate place. What makes the difference in these neighbor seas? Not the Jordan River.

Not the soil in which they lie; nor the country round about.

Here is the difference, The Sea of Galilee receives but does not keep the River Jordan. It gives what it receives so that life may abound. For every drop that flows into it another drop flows out. **The giving and receiving go on in equal measure.**

The other sea is shrewder, hoarding its income jealously. It will not be tempted into any generous impulse. It swallows up and keeps every drop of the Jordan it receives. **The Sea of Galilee gives and lives.** The other sea gives nothing.

It is named The Dead Sea.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

If you have attended the Catholic Community of St. Luke the Evangelist for any length of time, you have heard us use the word Stewardship and the fact that St. Luke's is a Stewardship Parish. This means that from our foundation in 1975 we have sought to incorporate the teachings of sacred scripture in the way that we live our lives as a parish.

It is one thing to make the claim to be a Stewardship Parish, however, it is another issue all together to be able to make the statement that everyone who is attending the parish of St. Luke the Evangelist are actively embracing and living out the call to be Christian Stewards. Stewards understand and live with the concept that everything they are, have, do or will ever have be or do is first and foremost a gift from God. We, then, are care-takers of the gifts and talents that God has given us to be distributed to His holy people.

Our Concept of Giving states that we all understand, first and foremost, that God teaches us, through Holy Scripture, that the first 10% of our time, talent and treasure belong to Him. Secondly, that the financial needs of the parish are paid for from our Sunday collections – our donations. I often hear people say that our ministries are “free.” They are NOT free. We do not charge for our ministries because of our “concept of giving”, which expects that we all (hopefully) contribute our 10%. It is because of this belief that we do not charge for the various individual ministries such as religious formation, weddings, baptisms, Quince Años celebrations, etc. We pay for these ministries from our Sunday donations. It is an “honor” system whereby we presume that all parishioners are contributing of their time, talent and finances.

As you read through the pages of this ministry booklet, you will see an amazing display of service opportunities. It is important, that as you look at these various descriptions, you also remember that these represent your brothers and sisters who have recognized within them a call to service—to ministry. As they are called, so are we all called to practice and share our God-given gifts and talents for our own benefit, as well as for the service of others. As a stewardship parish, we invite and encourage every single person to be a part of our community and use the gifts that the Lord has entrusted to them.

We are planning to bless the first building on our new property on May 24, 2014 at 2 p.m. and everyone is invited. We have outgrown our present location and need to expand. This is a testimony to the life that this parish has.

May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ descend upon each of you and upon your entire family.

Pope Francis Calls Catholics to be a "Little Poorer"

A June 7, 2013, Vatican Press Release revealed one such statement by the Holy Father:

*Poverty in the world is a scandal. In a world where there is so much wealth, so many resources to feed everyone, it is unfathomable that there are so many hungry children, that there are so many children without an education, so many poor persons. Poverty today is a cry. We all have to think if we can become a little poorer, all of us have to do this. How can I become a little poorer in order to be more like Jesus, who was the poor Teacher?*

For those who seek a deeper relationship with the Lord, the Holy Father's words offer a thought-provoking challenge notwithstanding his kind, soft-spoken delivery.

***Christian stewards recognize Jesus' teaching in that statement:  
For whom much is given, much is expected.***

This is can be a hard gospel teaching to embrace. The Holy Father's words test our comfortable lifestyles and give us some stewardship questions to think about. No matter what our perceived social or economic status, the question remains: Can we become a little poorer in order to be more like Jesus?

In that same June 7 address, the pope went on to express something he has lived out in his own life among the poor in Latin America: "Look," he said, "You can't speak of poverty without having experience with the poor. You can't speak of poverty in the abstract that doesn't exist."

In that last quote lies a great kernel of truth. As we discern our own level of generosity toward the poor, we must come face-to-face with them, and not in some vague manner either. Perhaps a day spent with refugees resettling in your community, or at a daycare serving low income children, or helping people select groceries at a food bank will bring poverty home to us and help in our discernment.

These are challenging questions to ask ourselves: How can we become a little poorer in our own lives? How do we come face-to-face with the poor?


Ministers serve Southeast Memorial Hospital by praying with and taking communion to patients once a month as a part of a rotating schedule along with neighboring parishes.
