The Bicentennial Endowment Campaign was initiated in 1993 as the largest fund-raising effort in the history of our Archdiocese - \$20 million! As you review the enclosed report, you will see that the purpose of the campaign was fourfold: to substantially increase the Endowment Funds for Catholic Schools and Notre Dame Seminary, establish an Endowment for Aged and Infirm Priests, and assist each parish by returning forty percent of individual pledge payments to their parish.

As of October 8th, I am pleased to report that we have received over \$17,236,010 of these pledges. With the continued support of individuals, foundations and local businesses, I firmly believe that we will collect the equivalent of every dollar of the \$22,404,589 pledged.

I realize that, as in the last three years, we will lose some pledged monies as families move from the Archdiocese or go to their eternal reward with God. Because of this, it is even more important for new families and businesses to participate with us through their contributions to the Bicentennial Campaign and further help the beneficiaries already supported through these endowments. As you know, these beneficiaries may represent an inner city child receiving a Catholic education, the priest who comforted you in the past, or perhaps the young man who is considering a priestly vocation. And certainly, present and future gifts to the campaign will benefit you, a parishioner whose parish has enjoyed and will continue to receive a large portion of the pledge receipts.

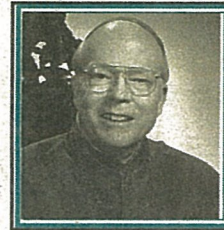

Schools Benefit During First Three Years of Campaign

With a sense of gratification and sincere appreciation, the leadership and staff of the Bicentennial campaign would like to thank and acknowledge all the people, businesses, corporations, and foundations that participated in and overwhelmingly supported the first three years of this historic \$20,000,000 BEC campaign.

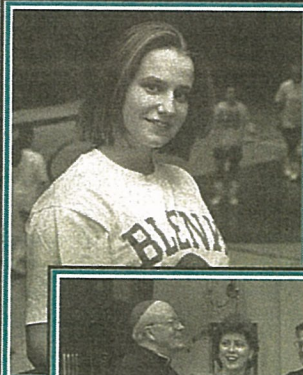
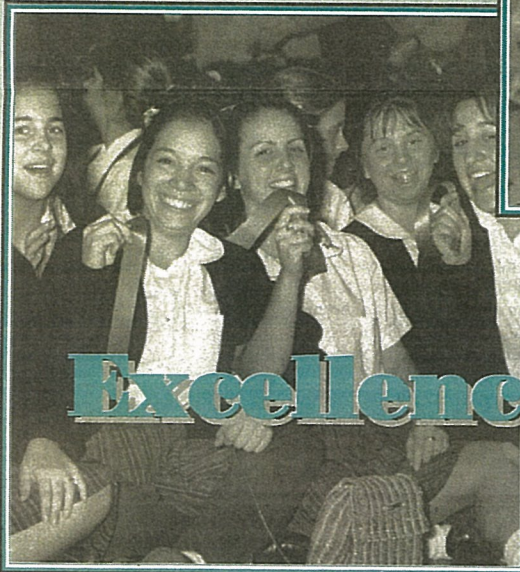
At the end of fiscal year 95-96, the campaign had raised more than \$16,500,000 or 83% of the original campaign goal and now with less than two years left until the completion of the Advanced and Corporate Phases, we are confident that the goal will not only be reached but exceeded.

Our Catholic schools have already put your gifts of treasure to good use. St. Anthony School in Gretna, Louisiana used a portion of the Bicentennial funds to establish a new computer lab. Students from Pre-K through eighth grade receive hands-on instruction daily with the use of specialized learning software and technology. St. Anthony's Science Lab also benefited from Bicentennial campaign monies. A multimedia video hardware setup was purchased for use with *Windows on Science*, an instructional software program. Msgr. Gerard W. Poche, pastor at St. Anthony, said that "these new additions to our curriculum will give our students the necessary tools to move forward and compete in this ever evolving world of technology." ♦

Excellence in Education

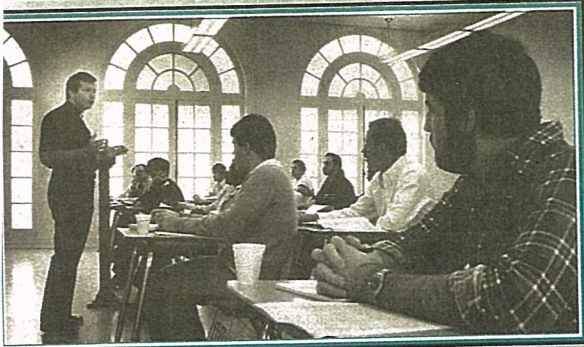

Through the years, the Catholic schools in our archdiocese have taken tremendous pride in providing a superior academic and moral education to our children and this year was no exception. On February 18, 1996, 266 high schools from across the nation were recognized for "excellence in education." Of these 266 high schools, four Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of New Orleans - *St. Mary's Dominican, De La Salle, Archbishop Chapelle and Archbishop Blenk* - were given the nation's highest award for educational excellence... the Blue Ribbon Award bestowed by the U.S. Department of Education. It is a great and rare privilege for any school to achieve this honor; however, for a couple of these high schools being the best in the nation is almost customary. With this being their third award for excellence in education, Archbishop Chapelle has joined the auspicious ranks of only two other schools in the nation to ever maintain such a track record. Similarly, the students and teachers at Dominican High School, who received their second award this spring, are without a doubt justifiably proud and wildly elated by their academic achievements. However, you can be sure that they are determined to become only the fourth school to ever win the Blue Ribbon Award three times.

It is often that we hear about the horrors and shortcomings of education in certain states of our Union, but because of your heartfelt generosity and steadfast support for Catholic schools through the Bicentennial Endowment Campaign, not only our children but also their children will enjoy and benefit from this high standard that has long been tradition in our Catholic schools. ♦

About Notre Dame Seminary

DID YOU KNOW?

- * over the past fiscal year, \$557,549 from the Bicentennial Endowment has been deposited into the Notre Dame Seminary Endowment Fund for the purpose of providing tuition assistance to the 105 seminarians currently enrolled in the seminary?
- * presently the Fund is valued at \$3,257,239 and that funds are withdrawn during the year to provide tuition support of the seminarians?
- * the seminary has experienced a consistent range of 90 to 100 students for the past 10 years?
- * the seminarians hail from 9 states and one foreign country representing the following Arch/dioceses: Alexandria, Atlanta, Baton Rouge, Beaumont, Biloxi, Birmingham, Charleston, Galveston/Houston, Houma-Thibodaux, Jackson, Lafayette, Lake Charles, Little Rock, Memphis, Mobile, Nashville, New Orleans, Palm Beach, Pensacola/Tallahassee, St. Augustine, Shreveport and Tororo, Uganda?
- * congregations represented include Congregation of Mother Coredeptrix (CMC), Discalced Carmelite Fathers (OCD), Order of St. Benedict (OSB), and Society Incarnation Consecration Mission (ICM)?
- * enrollment in schools of theology around the country has declined approximately 150 to 200 students per year?
- * Notre Dame Seminary's enrollment ranks 8th largest among the 52 seminaries in the United States (the average is 70 to 80 students)?
- * the present cost of tuition, excluding room and board, totals \$11,776 including \$6,776 for tuition alone?
- * the difference between tuition and actual cost of educating the seminarian is \$2,000?
- * the latest fiscal year budget projects a total of \$1,566,128?

Aged & Infirm Priests Bulletin

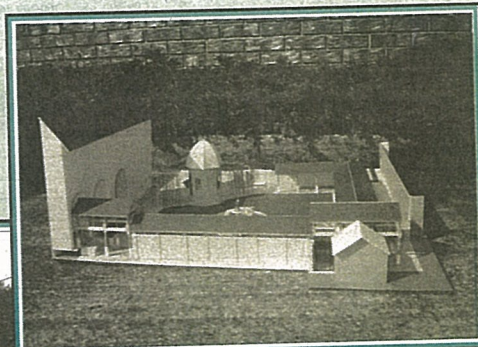
Funds withdrawn from the Aged & Infirm Priests fund have been used in the past year to assist with the medical and housing expenses of these dedicated servants, some of whom are still active with administrative and pastoral duties in our Archdiocesan church! The current value of the endowment fund is \$2,402,411 and it has a current market value of \$2,652,005.

Parish Collection Updates

The Bicentennial Campaign is for the Parishes, Too

The Bicentennial Endowment Campaign was also initiated to provide support for the parishes of our archdiocese. More than \$5,555,971 or 40% of all monies pledged have been returned to the parishes to be used at their discretion. St. Peter in Covington will soon begin much needed renovations to the interior of the church with the bicentennial funds that they have received. St. Andrew the Apostle in New Orleans has used its portion to renew old parish programs and to assist in funding a new school building which opened in September, 1996. Other parishes have utilized bicentennial monies to pay off outstanding parish debts, set up computer labs in their schools, make much-needed repairs to parish buildings, and some like St. Joseph in Gretna are adding additional parking and upgrading the access ways to the church. With the parish phase of the campaign now at an end, we are thankful that your contributions have allowed the parishes of our archdiocese to not only provide for their futures but to assist them in the present. ♦
