
Ask the Lord how He wants you to grow in mission and assist others to do the same and be ready to engage those questions on September 7/8.

*God's mercy, poured out in abundance,
gives us the grace to know who we are, to whom we belong,
and how we are to live.*

*Our natural response to God's grace is to love -

Sacrificial Love

A life lived in love as a disciple includes embracing, cultivating, enjoying, sharing - and sometimes also giving up or sacrificing - the goods of human life. The word Sacrifice has its origin in Latin and literally translated means "to make a sacred gift."

Understandably, the word became associated with suffering, since Jesus is God's most sacred gift to us, and His suffering and death is part of our salvation journey. We need to remember, however, that God's most sacred gift, his greatest sacrifice was the incarnation itself. "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16).

The true nature of our sacrifices then is to choose a course of action that brings about the flourishing of God's love in the world, even if that action is initially difficult.

A parent who sacrifices personal time to teach their child's faith formation class knows fruit will come from the sacrifice, as does the person who contributes generously to support families in need at Christmas time. They know that these sacrifices are worth the cost.

If the parish is going to reflect good discipleship, it needs for individuals and households to make personal sacrificial commitments through many avenues, including consistent financial contributions. Fr. Ron Clubb, a deceased priest in this Archdiocese, often reminded his parishioners that we are asked to give as Christ gave - from all that we have, not from what is left over.

Seen in this light, our Sunday giving provides us with another opportunity to respond generously to the gift of God's mercy, as well as meet the real and practical needs of a large parish trying to serve an even larger community.

Sharing God's Love

Because of God's extravagant mercy we have been gifted first with life, and then with knowledge and faith in God. From there we can see God's hand in the abundance of our lives – family, friends, homes, parish, education, work, recreation, material possessions. In faith, we want to not only proclaim God's goodness, we want to share love shared with us.

As a parish, we share our faith with each other and with those who desire to know God. There are literally hundreds of opportunities each week for us to share faith with each other. First and most importantly we share faith with each other when we gather for worship on Sundays (and week days), when we celebrate the sacraments, and when we hold each other in prayer. We also share faith with children and families in our school, formation, and youth ministry programs. We also share our faith through ministries involving men's and women's groups, married couples, retreats, and pastoral outreach to those in need and those who suffer. God's love and mercy are evident when we celebrate baptisms, first communions, confirmations, and weddings.

Our sharing of faith is not limited to only those who are parishioners, but to anyone who desires to know God. We welcome those who are new. Maybe they are new to the Lakeville area, or new to All Saints, or even new to faith in God. As a parish, we welcome and accompany each person as they discover God's love. We also support each other as we love those who have distanced themselves from the Church and from God. Over the past few years more than 200 parishioners have prepared themselves for outreach ministries through programs like Return, School of Discipleship, and the Catechetical Institute.

Serving in Love

To meet the call of discipleship, every person in the parish needs to make a commitment to share faith with others. This commitment to act brings us to a final mark of discipleship, Service. We introduce children to service in simple ways - by buying and wrapping gifts at Christmas for a family in need, donating an hour or two working as a family at fall festival, or helping an older neighbor with yard work. Even these simple acts of service can make real God's love and mercy.

At All Saints, there are literally hundreds of ways for you and your family to consider loving service. In the pages that follow you will find descriptions of parish ministries that have a current or ongoing need for mission partners (volunteers) to share their gift.

These descriptions are organized around five primary categories: Liturgy, Learning, Sacraments, Service, and Parish Life/Community. For example, you will find a description for a middle school small group leader under Learning and for a fall festival team leader under Parish Life. Remember, this booklet contains descriptions of current opportunities for fruitful service, not descriptions for every parish program or activity.

Please read about these service opportunities before Discipleship Weekend, September 7/8. Find a few that interest you and make a point of visiting those tables that weekend. Ask questions, get information, and sign up for orientation or training, if needed.

The hope is, that by Commitment Sunday on October 12/13, you will be ready to respond to God's mercy by making or renewing commitments to share your faith and share your gifts in service, as well as make a financial commitment in support of the parish's mission.



At All Saints we typically refer to those engaged in parish service as *Mission Partners* rather than volunteers. Why? Because we believe we are all partners in Christ's mission ~ *Sharing, Sacrificing, and Serving* each other in love and faith.

Similar information specific for youth (Grades 4-12) will be distributed through our formation programs (School & FEP) and available mid-September in the Parish Office.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Do you consider time spent in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament prayerful stewardship? Spending an hour with Jesus in Adoration can be just that and more. Adoration is open to scheduled adorers (24 hours/day, 7 days/week) and St. Mary's Chapel is open daily to all parishioners and visitors, Mon-Sat, except during times of Mass or funerals. Morning/Afternoon/Evening/Night Division Leadership is essential to coordinating adoration scheduling. Could Jesus be calling you to help with this quiet, yet powerful ministry? Time Commitment: 1 hour/week.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Leaders help at one or two Masses a month to lead children age 4 to Grade 4 to hear and learn from the Sunday readings in an age appropriate way. More leaders are needed.

Also, one or two assistants are needed to help the main leader with things like reading, song leading, song hand motions, stories, enactment of Bible readings, and group management. This ministry is offered in the chapel at the Saturday, 5 PM Mass and at the 9 & 11 AM Masses on Sunday morning. Training is provided.

SOUND SYSTEM MINISTRY

A dedicated sound system minister at each Mass ensures that clergy and lectors can be heard, and musicians are well-balanced. The sound board can be controlled via iPad from anywhere in the Church, so you may sit with your family during Mass. Previous experience with digital sound boards is helpful, but not required. Help is needed at all Mass times. Time Commitment: 1-hour initial training, 1.5 hours/ Mass, additional training/formation as needed.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Extraordinary Ministers assist in the distribution of Communion when large numbers or other pastoral considerations warrant. As ministers of Holy Communion, these individuals bring the true presence of Jesus Christ to His people. This ministry is open to adults and youth who've celebrated Confirmation, and who are free of any impediments to participating in the sacramental life of the Church.

Time Commitment: 1-hour initial training, 1.25 hours/ Mass, 3-hour annual formation event.



Whether sharing the Gospel message with our little ones, preparing vessels for Holy Mass, taking an hour in Adoration, or decorating our worship space, there is year-round need for seasonal and liturgical assistance.

GREETERS

Greeters exist to welcome anyone to Mass or other parish events. They stand inside and outside the church and create waves of welcome through their smile, cheery voice, and salutations. A welcoming and warm environment allows for hearts to be open and receptive to God. They help those unfamiliar with the church with the location of restrooms, nursery, etc. Greeters are required to arrive at church 15 minutes prior to Mass and greet through the Gloria. New Greeters are needed at all Mass times.

Time Commitment: 30-minute initial training, 15 minutes before a Mass, 3-hour annual formation event.

LEADERS OF THE ROSARY

Parishioners are needed to help lead the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Rosary in St. Mary's Chapel on Tuesday nights, one hour prior to the evening Mass. Not sure how to lead the Rosary? We will teach you!

Time Commitment: Lead once every six weeks; 30 minutes.

LECTORS

Lectors proclaim God's Word to the assembly, thus bringing Jesus Christ to His people. In addition to serving at Mass, this ministry also requires prayerful preparation prior to Mass. A level of comfort when in front of large crowds and a good speaking voice are necessary. This ministry is open to adults and youth who have celebrated their Confirmation.

Time Commitment: 1-hour initial training, 1.5 hours/Mass, 3 hours annual formation event.

SACRISTANS

Sacristans work behind the scenes to prepare the sacred vessels. Sacristans help to create a prayerful liturgy for the community by freeing the priest to give his attention to the prayer and pastoral care of the people. This ministry is open to adults and youth who have celebrated Confirmation.

Time Commitment: 1-hour initial training, 1.75 hours/Mass, 3-hour annual formation event.

SACRISTY WALK-THROUGH

Mission partners are needed to walk through and refill supplies (wine, hosts, candles) in the sacristy every Monday and Friday, to make sure everything is ready for the clergy for daily and Sunday Masses. This ministry can be done with a friend, and training is provided. If you attend morning Mass, this could easily be done right after Mass. Time Commitment: 30 minutes, 1-2 times/month.

USHERS

Ushers create a welcoming environment at Mass by seating people, taking up the collection, and facilitating the Communion procession, all to make the Mass reverent and prayerful for all. Our parish has a great need for new ushers. Time Commitment: 1-hour initial training, 1.5 hours/Mass, 3 hour annual formation event.

LINENS

The linens used at Mass must be properly cleaned and pressed in order to be used again at subsequent Masses. This is a wonderful opportunity for those who wish to offer their talents to the parish, but would like to do so in a behind-the-scenes way.

Time Commitment: 3-4 hours every six weeks.

LITURGICAL AESTHETICS TEAM

Do you have a good sense of design? or like to work with plants? or like to climb ladders? Please consider joining the Liturgical Aesthetics Team, who works to enhance our worship space by reflecting liturgical seasons with beauty and simplicity. The Team hangs banners, works with fabrics and plants, and manages the parish decorating events for Christmas and Easter. Members also learn what the Church teaches about environment in the liturgy.

Time Commitment: 1-2 hours/month (October-June); an additional 6 hours for Christmas/Easter decorating.

MUSIC MINISTRIES

Catholic liturgical musicians use music to lead worshipers to a deeper connection with God through the Paschal Mystery—the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ, celebrated at every Mass.

INSTRUMENTALISTS

There are many opportunities for instrumentalists to serve in music ministry at All Saints, from playing the flute or clarinet at a typical Sunday Mass, playing in a brass ensemble for Christmas and Easter, or playing guitar or bass with one of the 11am bands. An audition is required.

CANTORS

Cantors have a special ministry in encouraging the sung prayer of the assembly. Cantors also proclaim the Psalm in a prayerful and reverent manner, that leads people to communal prayer.

Due to the unique nature of this ministry, ongoing formation and training is encouraged and expected of participants. An audition is required.

Time Commitment: personal practice is expected; 30-minute rehearsal before Mass; additional rehearsals for Christmas/Easter.



Mission Partners make our liturgies more beautiful and prayerful with song and instruments, ranging from woodwinds to brass. We have need of your talents & gifts. Join us!



VOCAL ENSEMBLES

All voice parts are welcome! Smaller ensembles provide an opportunity to share your musical gifts without a weekly choir rehearsal, yet aid the congregation by providing musical support at all Mass times.

Time Commitment: 45-minute rehearsal prior to scheduled Mass; sings for Mass 1-2 times per month, year-round.

- **5:00PM**
This small ensemble leads the congregation by strengthening the melody.
- **7:30AM**
This groups learns 2-3-part hymn settings and choral music.
- **11:00AM WOMEN'S GROUP**
This groups learns 2-3-part contemporary song settings and occasional choral music.
- **11:00AM MAN CHOIR**
What's that you say? You are a man? Then Man Choir is for you! We rehearse and sing once a month. If you are looking for a meaningful way to serve Jesus Christ and our community plan to join us.

9:00AM CHOIR

Our largest parish choir sings a variety of liturgical music, from Bach to music by living Catholic composers. 9AM Choir members also sing as part of the Festival Choir. Teens are welcome.

Time Commitment: Wed. evening rehearsals 7-8:30pm; sings at 9am Mass three times per month (Sept-May); arrive 45 minutes prior to Mass.

FESTIVAL CHOIR

Singers come together as a Festival Choir to prepare 4-part music for Christmas and Easter. Teens are welcome.

Time Commitment: Wed. evening rehearsals 7-8:15pm, Nov-Dec and Feb-Mar; sings for Christmas Midnight Mass and the Easter Triduum.

FUNERAL CHOIR

The funeral choir provides singers with the opportunity to participate in praying for the living and the dead through their gift of music. Funeral choir members are not expected to sing for every funeral (about 40 per year) - simply come as you are able.

Time Commitment: 30-minute rehearsal prior to funeral; additional rehearsals as needed; funerals are typically scheduled at 11am on weekdays.

ADULT ADVISORY MEMBERS

This Advisory function is to give guidance and support to our parish's adult faith formation efforts. It meets monthly 8 times/year for a one-hour meeting.

ADULT FORMATION EVENT HOSPITALITY

A variety of Adult Faith Formation series and events are offered throughout the year. Hospitality helpers are needed to assist with greeting and/or set up/clean-up of hospitality supplies.

BIBLE STUDY GROUP LEADERS

Through the school year the parish offers Bible Study series that meet on Tuesday mornings and also on Thursday evenings. Sessions typically include a large group introduction, small group discussion, and a closing presentation.

SMALL GROUP LEADERS/ADULTS

We have many small groups to support adults in their faith life through service, discussion, prayer, and building caring relationships. We continue to form more groups, which typically meet two or more times/month. Consider leading a small group this year. Easy-to-use materials and training are provided.

Run copies, fill file folders, prepare activities or help with other details involved with preparation for the weekly FEP classes. Time Commitment: 1-2 hours in the morning or afternoon weekly during the months of September to April - or called as needed.

FEP PROGRAM AIDE

Those who would like to assist the programs run smoothly each week from Sept-April. This may include providing classroom or supply assistance to small group leaders and catechists, welcoming and directing program participants, and helping with hallway supervision.

Time Commitment: The dates and times of this weekly commitment vary depending on which age group and program is being served.

THE CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS)

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based religious formation program for children ages 3-6. It provides a "hands-on" environment for children called an Atrium, in which both children and catechists can hear, ponder, and celebrate essential mysteries of the Catholic Faith as revealed in Scripture and the Liturgy. Three discipleship opportunities include serving as a catechist, assistant, or atrium team member. Training provided. Time Commitment: 2 hours a week, September-April. SPIRIT KIDS (GR 1-5) CATECHIST

SPIRIT KIDS is our formation program for Grades 1-5. Catechists or Co-Catechists have responsibilities which include preparing and presenting weekly formation lessons, classroom prayer, and participation in group and grade level social and service events. Classroom Aides assist in the classroom without the expectation of preparing or presenting the lesson. EDGE (GRADES 6-8) SMALL GROUP LEADER

EDGE is our middle school formation program. Small group leaders are needed weekly September to April, which includes leading small group discussion, praying with a small group, and engaging in relational ministry for a group of 5-8 teens. CHOSEN (GRADES 9-10) SMALL GROUP LEADERS

CHOSEN is our senior high Confirmation formation program. Small group leaders are needed to facilitate small group discussion, pray with a small group, and engage in relational ministry for a group of 8-10 teens. Ideally, a small group leader would begin with a small group in 9th Grade and retain the relationships through 10th Grade as they complete their preparation for Confirmation late in the spring. Adults help with retreats, Scripture for Lunch (Advent/Lent gathering with school teens over lunch to eat and pray), small groups after school, prayer opportunities, and visioning related to school campus ministry.

CHAPERONES

DT small groups are for teens who have had an encounter with Christ and desire to deepen it through a commitment to regular meetings, prayer, and formation. Groups are gender specific and follow YDisciple curriculum. Adult leaders facilitate these groups by planning the topic and activities for the DT group.

Youth nights for middle-schoolers take place the first and third (some exceptions) Fridays of the month, and involve faith formation, prayer, food and fun! 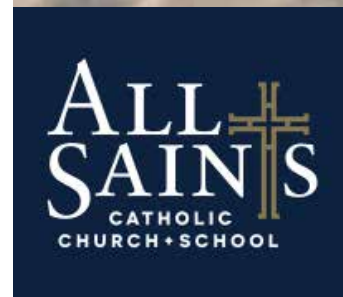
