Our parish has embraced this vision and continues to persevere in making it a reality. It has truly become part of our parish DNA!! It is what we measure the plans and projects that are considered against – will this help us to achieve the Vision?

In this year's annual report you can see how St. Ann has used the stewardship gifts that parishioners so generously give. Your gifts support the initiatives that continue to move us closer to seeing the vision in action across the parish. Please review this information. Financial Health of the Parish

We are pleased to report that our external auditors have once again found no exceptions with St. Ann's annual accounting reports for the fiscal year 2018-19. We ended the fiscal year with a slight surplus. Collections were 3% below budget; thankfully, this was offset by lower-than-budgeted spending levels across the parish. As we move into the upcoming fiscal year we will continue to closely monitor collections as well as operational and project spending. The Finance Council fully supports the Building Hope Campaign that will allow us to finish out the St. Ann Center so that we can utilize all the space we have available to fulfill our vision.

A Look Ahead

We have approved a budget for the 2019-20 fiscal with year a small deficit. We are proceeding with cautious optimism in a year that will once again bring new opportunities for our church family.

As the parish moves forward with the "form" portion of our vision, we will work diligently to ensure that we can fund initiatives and ongoing programs that provide spiritual support for our parishioners.

It is an exciting time at St. Ann. Our Children's Ministry is developing programming that emphasizes the importance of family involvement and will strive to "form" disciples at an early age.

Growth and change are a big part of what makes St. Ann the vibrant, welcoming parish it is today. We need your continued support to achieve the goals and success the Lord has in His plans for St. Ann.

CHILDRENS MINSTERIS



In St. Ann Children's Ministry, we are working hard to partner with the parents to help bring their children to Jesus, form them as disciples, and send them to transform the world.

In our Spanish community, we've invited our parents to the Assembly Room for formation every time their children are here — and the parents love it! We've had a great turnout and have heard fantastic feedback from parents. One mom convinced her friend to come to the Assembly Room by telling her it's not boring parent meetings; it's exciting and enriching! The children also love having their parents learn alongside them. We are moving away from a classroom drop-off model to a model where we work together with our parents.

In our English community, we are starting to mostly prepare for the sacraments at home. Parents and children come to St. Ann about once a month and go home to deepen their understanding of the sacraments together using the beautiful *Blessed* books and videos. We're also starting the process multiple times a year so children can begin preparing soon after expressing an interest in receiving the sacraments. Parents have said it's easier on family life; it allows them to cater to their child's needs, and it's like a refresher course for the parents.

This is our last year of the classroom drop-off model in English. Next year, we'll begin Grace, where parents and children will come to St. Ann once a month to pray, learn, ask questions, and deepen their relationship with Jesus and with each other. We'll also offer a fun community event once a month for all families to attend. In Grace, we'll focus on one topic each month for the whole family, who will then continue their formation at home with prayer, conversations, and fun activities. Parishes that have moved to this model have seen incredible fruit: children and parents love coming to church, they come back to receive the sacraments more often, and families continue learning about their faith after receiving their sacraments.

On Sundays, we continue with Sunday School at 8 AM, 10 AM, and 12 PM. The children get to experience a fun, welcoming, safe environment where they can play and pray with each other and ask their questions about faith.

We continue to ask for prayers as we embark on this journey! Each year we have about 350 children receive Reconciliation and Eucharist for the first time and about 675 children in ongoing Faith Formation. It takes an amazing team of very dedicated people to continue to grow this ministry. Thank you for your prayers and support.

I have been at St. Ann since 2012 and during that time, the universal Catholic Church has seen millions leave the Catholic faith and never return. Studies show that a person decides if they are going to leave their faith by age 13.

This is such a critical time in a young person's life and we in St. Ann Youth Ministry are here to stop that trend and help young people embrace Christ and all he has to offer!

Our yearly retreats, Bible studies, youth nights, conferences, and service opportunities are all an opportunity for youth to encounter the saving power of Jesus Christ. Each teen is cared for by trained Core Members who witness the faith and walk along a teen's faith journey. I am so grateful to be working with the youth and core members who will one day be leaders in our very parish.

This past year we made an intentional effort to call on the help of the Holy Spirit in our mission to encounter teens. It has had a profound impact! At the Parish Mission this past year you heard the story of one of our teens who encountered the healing power of the Holy Spirit in her life. She had dealt with breathing issues for years and, through prayer teams on one of our retreats, she encountered healing and was able to breathe unhindered for the first time in years. Praise the Lord!

Another memorable experience of this past year came from our annual Mission Trip to Laredo. St. Ann Youth Ministry was asked by Bishop Tamayo, the Bishop of Laredo, to build a chapel at a senior center that is being used for incoming immigrants. A group of teens worked so hard for a week — clearing out an old storage unit, painting, sheetrocking, and preparing this space for people to encounter the Lord. At the end of the week, we held a Mass in this Chapel that was packed with people of all ages and backgrounds. This Chapel is a refuge for those who have gone through so much in their life.

Stories like these are what we get to experience every day in our ministry because of the generous donations of the parish. This past year, 600 youth gather weekly for prayer, fellowship, and teachings at our youth nights in High School, Middle School, and Bilingual Student Ministries. Over 800 youth experienced a retreat this past year, and our largest group ever of 203 missionaries went down to Laredo for the mission trip.

All of you who are reading this report – thank you for making this possible through your financial support. I am so proud of what we accomplished this past year and look forward to 2019-2020 being an even better year! Come Holy Spirit!

2020 VISION

To make our St. Ann vision a reality – to really bring people to Jesus, form them as disciples and send them to transform the world – we need a plan. Building that plan, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, has been the task of the St. Ann Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) over the last 12-18 months. We are excited to share the fruits of this labor as we move into the new fiscal year.

Who PPC Is

The Pastoral Council is a strategic body that serves in an advisory capacity to the pastor in matters of parish direction. We take a broad view of church parish life, our vision, and all people in the parish, and we work closely with Fr. Henry and the Senior Leadership Team to create plans that help St. Ann live out its vision. Our culturally diverse members have extensive parochial, personal, and corporate experience which they have put to work for St. Ann through the ministry of the Pastoral Council.

How We Do Strategic Planning

A strategic plan that meets the dynamic needs of our parish must be fluid and adaptable, which is why we embrace a five-year rolling plan model. That means that we recommend priorities to Fr. Henry, then put supporting strategies, goals, and timelines in place five years at a time, measuring and re-evaluating all those elements annually.

Our Plan

The priorities and goals set at the parish level will drive the initiatives happening inside and outside our walls over the next five years — one year at a time, moving and changing as needed. In the next year, our focus as a parish will be on intentional discipleship – the "form" portion of our vision.

You'll see and hear more in the next 12-18 months about what it means to be an intentional disciple, how you can find your place at St. Ann as a follower of Jesus, and what He is calling you to as you grow. The strategies being put in place will work in the background to help provide form and structure to the realities our guests and parishioners experience within the parish, as well as the ways we carry Jesus to the world around us.

We believe the Holy Spirit has bold plans for St. Ann Parish! We are so grateful for the opportunity to serve the Lord, our parish, and our community. We look forward to building hope together in the coming year.
