

As your Pastor, and with the assistance of our parochial vicars and deacons, our primary role is to provide for the spiritual and pastoral needs of the faithful. As members of the broader community, we are committed to participating in the larger response to the Pandemic by our cities and state. Bishop Jugis' decision to dispense from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, as well as the canceling or curtailing of all other liturgical events and gatherings, was based on the CDC and state government guidelines. Our primary concern is the holiness, health and safety of our parishioners. We are praying for all who have been impacted by the current health crisis, especially the sick and their care givers. We must continue to pray and support those most vulnerable – the poor, those with less stable employment, and parents who need to work and are unable to find childcare. In a special way, we want to support the elderly, sick and shut-ins who may feel isolated and lonely. In the spirit of Lent, I ask all of us to embrace the works of mercy with zeal and to practice a spirit of gratitude and generosity to others. In the spirit of almsgiving please continue to spend time in prayer, donate to our parish offertory and the Diocesan Support Appeal, and consider dropping food at our local community outreach organizations.

Please know that we are committed to continuing the good work of our parish and the Church at this time. We want to thank each of you for the many ways you support our mission, and ask that you please continue to support the work of our Church. Our parish is dependent upon your weekly financial gifts to continue its ministries in this critical time of crisis when we are not able to attend Mass. Our weekly offertory of approximately

\$30,000 helps to offset our expenses and provide assistance to those in need. With the closing of Mass, we are not receiving that general offertory.
