Established with funds from the Centennial Campaign along with some special donations, the doors to Emily House opened in 2018 as a program of Catholic Charities of Acadiana to address the needs of homeless families within the Diocese. Donations through the Bishop's Services Appeal sustain more than 90% of the cost to operate this shelter on a day-to-day basis. I am more grateful than ever that the residents of Emily House have a place of refuge.

During the COVID-19 crisis, Catholic Charities of Acadiana has continued to feed and house homeless individuals and families. This act of mercy takes on


