A Message from Monsignor

When this Lent began, some of the kids were sharing what they were giving up for the forty days. I must say their list was impressive, and I was more than embarrassed that my aspirations were not as heroic. When we began Lent, I wondered if the Lord would want me to fast from my favorites of Diet Mountain Dew, Hershey bars with almonds, or biscuits at breakfast. I never imagined that I would be asked to fast from the celebration of Mass. Already I miss being together with you and the Lord at the Eucharistic table. Already

the fast from prayer groups, Bible studies, Faith Formation, and our school has had a serious effect on the life of our parish. Just one week in, and it already feels like it's going to be a particularly hard fast to follow.

It's precisely because it's so hard that this may become one of the most fruitful fasts and Lents of our time. We embrace the discipline of Lent and the sacrifice of a fast to help us grow in self-control or some virtue. Perhaps, this Lent will help us grow in our spirit of profound gratitude for what we cannot now celebrate. But how?

Well, there is an expression that familiarity breeds dullness. When something, even a very good and extraordinary something, is around us all the time or available to us when we want, we naturally start to take it for granted. This can happen even with the Blessed Sacrament, since we are familiar with having multiple options to attend Mass. This will not be the case for a while. But rather than complain, let's adopt a perspective that appreciates the privilege that has been ours. With a renewed and a heightened sense of gratitude for the amazing action of God among us, it may be possible that this fast could lead to even greater dedication and devotion of our celebrations of Eucharist. With this perspective, we can also see that our sacrifice from the Blessed Sacrament pales in comparison as a mere inconvenience to those whose very gifts of life and health are at risk. We will meet the devastating effect of this pandemic with courage and perseverance.

A Message from the Principal of St. Pius X Catholic School

In accordance with Governor Cooper's executive order (Saturday, March 14), guidance from the North Carolina Department of Education, and in conjunction with the Chancery, Diocese of Charlotte Catholic Schools, including Saint Pius X Catholic School, have suspended all on-campus classes Monday, March 16, through Friday, March 27.

Effective immediately, all schools in the diocese have moved to remote learning modes. The staff of Saint Pius X has been working to effectively prepare for this possibility.

Following the finalization of planning on Monday, March 16, our teachers are reaching out to the parents of their respective students to communicate plans, information and resources.

Schedules are being communicated from Principal Chris Kloesz that provide students and families the opportunity to pick up personal items and any resources needed to continue distance learning from home. Updates to these schedules for picking up instructional resources, library books, etc., will be sent by teachers and administration using the parent portal in RenWeb/FACTS, via email blast, or through the Parent Alert text messaging system.

Keeping our students, families, and staff safe and healthy is of utmost importance. The Saint Pius X School staff is appreciative for everyone's understanding and patience as we work through these challenging times -- something no one has ever experienced. We will continue to monitor the situation as it unfolds, and updates will be posted as necessary.

sacraments and the holy hunger for the presence of Christ, is not new to North Carolina. Our missionary ancestors in faith patiently waited for a priest to come by horseback from Charleston to celebrate the sacraments just a couple times a year. In the midst of our pandemic, we would do well to remember the yellow fever epidemic in 1862 which ravaged the city of Wilmington. The pastor there begged Bishop Lynch of Charleston to help nurse the 1287 stricken victims. Three Sisters of Charity of our Lady of Mercy responded to the call for help until the epidemic subsided. Those sisters so endeared themselves to the people, that they were asked to remain in North Carolina permanently. From that health crisis 158 years ago, a legacy of loving service we know as the Sisters of Mercy began. I don't know how, nor am I sure what it will be, but I am confident that among the people of our parish and our state, God can and will bring something good and heroic, compassionate and kind from the chaos of this moment as well.

Our local Lenten fast could also make us more sensitive to the global situation existing in our world, like that of our brothers and sisters in Peru who frequently have similar fasts from the sacraments because of the scarcity of ministers and vast distances of parishes. Could it be that God would use this moment of sacrifice and scarcity of the sacrament to build among us a greater solidarity with those who lack access to the Eucharist because of the poverty of their society, and, even worse, the scarcity of religious freedom? Our fast from the Eucharist seems but temporary compared to theirs.

Our fasts are for 40 days, and we hope the end of this pandemic may be as expeditious. We pray that the loss of life and livelihood may be minimized, and this swift moving virus will be as short-lived as our Lenten Season. Strengthened by the hope that comes with Easter and the Season of New Life, may we look back with gratitude on the fast that made us hunger more deeply for the Bread of Life, and never take the Sacrament of our Savior for granted.

May we who are merely inconvenienced Remember those whose lives are at stake. May we who have no risk factors Remember those most vulnerable. May we who have the luxury of working from

Remember those who must choose between preserving their health or making their rent. May we who have the flexibility to care for our children when their schools close Remember those who have no options. May we who have to cancel our trips Remember those who have no safe place to go. May we who are losing our margin money in the tumult of the economic market Remember those who have no margin at all. May we who settle in for a quarantine at home Remember those who have no home. As fear grips our country,

During this time when we cannot physically Wrap our arms around each other, Let us yet find ways to be the loving embrace

of God to our neighbors.
