November 3, 2019 - 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Today salvation has come to this house” (Luke 19:9)

Jesus reached out to Zacchaeus Through Zacchaeus’ conversion and faith, and in his generosity to the poor and anyone he wronged, Jesus states that salvation has come to his house. How generous are we, as Christian stewards, in giving back to God a portion of our gifts — especially in difficult times?

November 10, 2019 – 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

“But those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God” (Luke 20:35)

The Sadducees, who did not believe in a resurrection after life, asked who will be married to the widow of the seven brothers in the next world. Jesus responded that earthly marriage as such, does not exist in heaven where all are alive in God, and are like angels. As faithful stewards, our salvation is a tremendous gift to us who strive to use our God-given talents to do His will here on earth.

November 17, 2019 – 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

“...You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives.” (Luke 21:5-19)

Jesus warns us to be prepared, for we know not when the end time will occur, nor even our own death. But Jesus also promises to protect us if we are faithful to Him. Are we faithful to His teachings and practicing the fundamentals of Christian stewardship in a way that would be pleasing to Him?

November 24, 2019 – Christ the King
