## ICSC Celebrates it's 60th Anniversary at the 2022 Stewardship Conference

Conference of Catholic Bishops in 1992. The year 2022 is also the pastoral letter's 30th anniversary. The conference offers its members and other attendees a chance to gather and reflect on stewardship in the Catholic Church and to continue to prepare for its transformational future.

The conference image is that of the vestibule dome of the Presentation Chapel in Saint Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. This chapel celebrates the presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the opening session of the Second Vatican Council, the bishops processed by this altar dedicated to Mary and asked for her prayers and intercessions. The United States bishops' pastoral letter pays homage to Our Lady as the model of Christian stewardship *par excellence*. ICSC is consecrated to

the Blessed Mother and we continue asking for her intercessions today.

The ICSC conference begins with a Eucharistic celebration on Sunday afternoon, October 2 at 3:30 pm and concludes with a closing Eucharistic celebration on Wednesday morning, October 5, at 10:30 am. All conference sessions are held at the Anaheim Hilton Hotel right next to Disneyland.

As a gathering of Catholic stewardship leaders and professionals in Catholic philanthropy from the United States and around the world, past attendees have said that the conference not only helps them promote stewardship as a way of life, but it also gives them courage, hope and a renewed spirit. We hope you will join us in October to be encouraged and inspired.
