

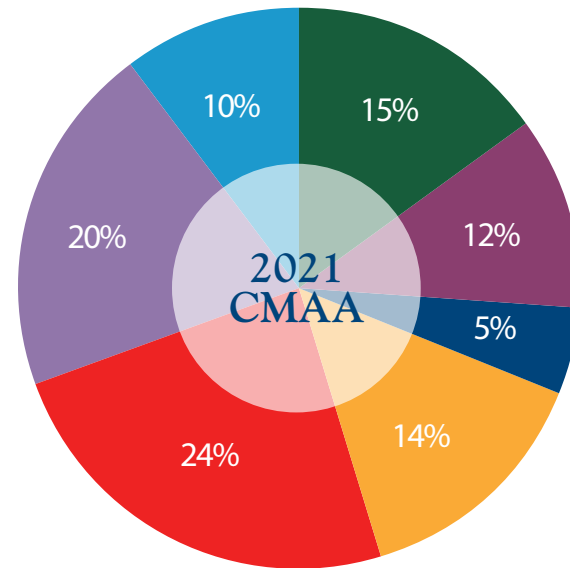


Prayerfully consider joining the Deo Gratas Society with your gift to the 2022 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal.

Catholic schools prepare young people ‘to be servers of the Lord’



For Esmeralda Elvir, teaching at a Catholic school is more than a job. It is her vocation, as well as a service to her community.

“We are preparing young people to become good citizens overall, to be servers of the Lord,” said Esmeralda, who is an assistant principal and fourth grade teacher at Bishop McNamara Catholic School’s Bradley site.

A longtime catechist before deciding to pursue a teaching degree, she continually seeks ways to embed the Gospel in every subject she teaches, not just during traditional religion classes. This goal — to nourish her students’ souls as well as their minds — is one shared throughout the Diocese of Joliet’s Catholic school system.

The member of St. John Paul II Parish in Kankakee also strives to treat every child with respect and dignity.

“I hope that in the future, my students remember me as someone who treated them just as Jesus would have,” she said. “Everyone’s welcome into my classroom. Everyone’s cared for, loved and appreciated.”

Your devotion to the works of the Lord through the CMAA supports the Catholic Schools Office, which serves the 51 Catholic elementary and high schools in the diocese as well as the administrators, teachers and staff members forming students academically and spiritually.

‘It’s nice to have people that care and go above and beyond to help you out’

When the home he had been renting went up for sale, James had 72 hours to find a new living situation. Already out of work from the pandemic and struggling with a health issue that limited his go-to employment options, the timing could not have been worse.

Since James was already familiar with Daybreak Center from being homeless 11 years ago, his first call was to the Catholic Charities emergency shelter in Joliet. Twenty-four hours later, he had three meals and a bed — and services to help him get back on his feet.

“Everybody says, ‘I’ll never be homeless; until that day comes,’ James said. “It’s nice to have people that care and go above and beyond to help you out.”

The men, women and children who live at Daybreak Center are assigned case managers who assess their specific needs and challenges. A multitude of services are available, such as job search assistance, healthy living workshops, counseling and connections with other community resources, to give clients like James the opportunity to become self-sufficient again.

James prefers not to consider what his life would be like without the kindness of Catholic Charities. “If it wasn’t for Daybreak, I honestly, truly, don’t know where I’d be right now,” he said.

Although Deacon Brian Geary loved being a teacher, he could not shake the feeling that something was missing, that he was not as fulfilled as he thought he would be in his career.

A seed had been planted while he was involved with campus ministry at the University of Illinois Champaign and, for the first time, part of a supportive community of clergy and like-minded young adults “on fire for their faith.”

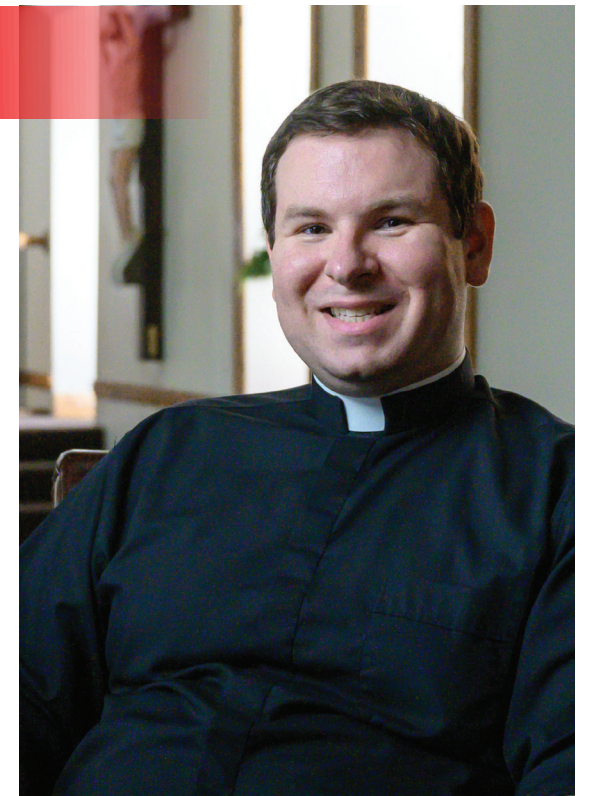
“It was really in college that I started meeting a lot of good and holy priests, priests who really loved their vocations, loved what they did, loved the Lord,” said Deacon Brian, who grew up as a member of St. Mary Parish in Mokena. “It was kind of through seeing their example that I began to at least ask the question, ‘Is this something that I could be called to as well?’”

Two years post-graduation, he contacted the vocations director of the Diocese of Joliet and, to the surprise of family and friends, began discerning a vocation to the priesthood. He entered the seminary in 2016 and was ordained a transitional deacon in 2021 — the final step before priestly ordination this spring.

As he completes his final year of formation at Mundelein Seminary, Deacon Brian is “interning” at St. John the Baptist Parish in Winfield. He reads the Gospel and preaches the homily at Mass, performs baptisms and has the same responsibilities as a permanent deacon, only he is preparing for the priesthood.

“My life has really been given over to doing the works of the Lord,” he said, “to being His instrument.”

Deaf Catholics should feel ‘at home in the Church’

As a boy in the Philippines, Father John Ronaldo Abulag struggled to connect with the deaf people in his community. But he felt called to communicate with them, even though he had yet to learn that sign language existed.

“I just smiled at them,” he said, never considering how those early experiences would influence his life — especially his future ministry.

A call to the priesthood during college led him to join the Dominican Missionaries for the Apostolates of the Deaf and Disabled, which sent him to the Diocese of Joliet two years ago to work toward priestly ordination while learning American Sign Language.

“The Church is not only for hearing people, it’s for everyone, including deaf people,” he said. “They should not feel neglected. They should feel at home in the diocese, at home in the Church.”

Father Abulag’s ordination last May was celebrated throughout our deaf community, which has been without a shepherd since 2016. He is equally excited to help meet the spiritual needs of deaf Catholics as their chaplain.

“This ministry enriches my own faith,” he said. “It made me realize that God is not only calling me to be the priest of the hearing people, but he also calls me to be the priest of these deaf people so that in my own little way, I could lead the community to God and increase their faith.”

Grandparents are ‘models of God’s love in our lives’

Colleen Lowery thinks often about how blessed she was to grow up with all four of her grandparents, especially now that she is a grandmother herself.

“They had a tremendous influence in my life, teaching me lessons of life and faith through their stories and unconditional love,” she said. “Grandparents are so special because they give us roots of our past and our present and are models of God’s love in our lives.”

After retiring from a career in ministry, Colleen prayed about how she could continue her passion of passing on the faith to others while emulating the grandparents she so admired. To her surprise, she discovered the Catholic Grandparents Association, and set out to bring the global organization to her parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Darien.

Since 2019, Our Lady of Mount Carmel grandparents have met monthly to support each other in the challenges and blessings that come with spiritually guiding their children and grandchildren. Colleen is now working with the Diocese of Joliet to bring the grandparent ministry to other parishes.

“We feel that it’s our responsibility and our vocation as grandparents to contribute to the family, to the Church and to society,” Colleen said. “We don’t want to be the generation that fails to pass on the faith, because it’s really the most important job we’ll ever have.”
