Having received visions of the moon in its full brilliance with a dark stripe across it, the Lord Jesus made it known to her the moon was a symbol of the life of the Church here on earth and the dark line was the absence of a liturgical feast in honor of the Eucharist. The feast was instituted years after her death and St. Juliana is credited by Pope Urban IV with bringing about the Feast of Corpus Christi.

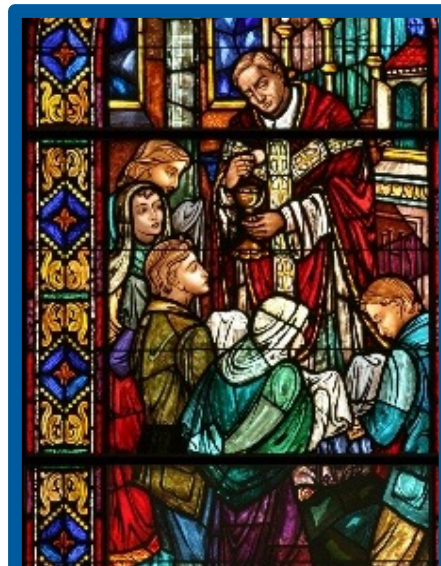
During the late 19th century and early 20th century Christians were dissuaded from frequent Eucharistic practice. Pope St. Pius X's Decree *Tridentia Synodus* promoted and encouraged frequent and even daily communion. He wrote that the Eucharist was the way to attain Christian perfection and not the culmination of it. He also wrote that the Eucharist is a "medicine for human frailty."



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
